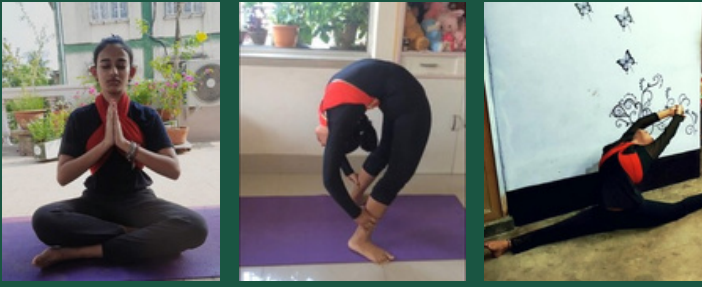
International Dance Day

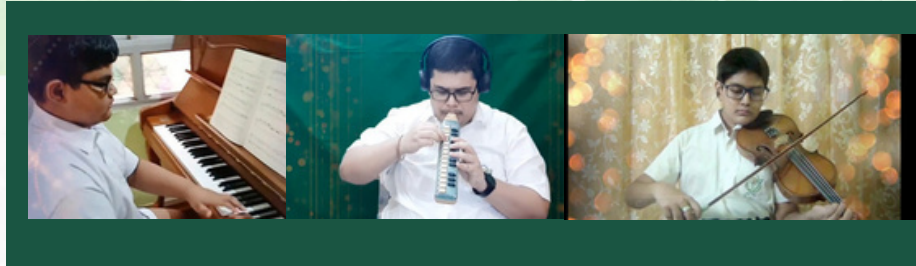


International Yoga Day

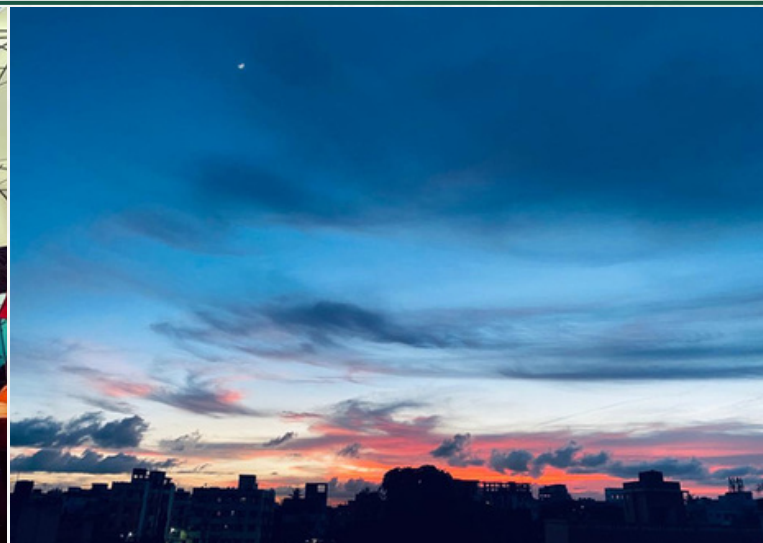
